

From the Parochial Vicar's Desk



Where are you from? Such a question resonates with all of us in how our answers reflect our identity. Perhaps we mention our current home or town, where we grew up as children, or even the country of origin our family immigrated from.

In our Gospel today Jesus deals with this question. We hear how Jesus ministered to those in his hometown ("native" place) and how because of their ignorance they did not believe in his good works. The son of a carpenter, they believed that he was limited to only a way of thinking in how he interacted with others or how he viewed the world. Instead of listening to the friend and fellow man, they took offense at his words and deeds, focusing on how they *wish* him to be rather than who he *is*.

How many times do we limit our understanding of someone from one interaction with them or one aspect of their identity? If we truly wish to grow with Christ, wouldn't we believe others can grow as well? All too often we limit ourselves to who people were in the past, rather than who they can be in the present. In this turbulent time there is the fear and anxiety of staying comfortable in the past to ignore what is going on in the present. Such reactions are normal for this divisive time in our diocese, country, and world. To have faith in Christ leads us to have hope in the present *and* future, including all its current strife.

We establish this from our second reading from Paul. Even with his conversion in the past he still must be vigilant as to ward against the thorn in his flesh. While we don't know specifically what his thorn was, we each have to be vigilant in the present to ward against our own thorns. We all have faults and fears that lead to sin, let us remind ourselves of the love God continually and perpetually has for us. Let us not be frightened in the present but diligent in creating a better future. Let us remain humble echoing the words given to Paul, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness."
