

WHEAT SCATTERED AND SOWN EVENTS

In the Gospel today, Jesus uses farming language to describe the Kingdom of God. He says, God's Kingdom grows like a seed that is sown. The seed grows slowly in its own time. The mustard seed, the smallest of seeds, "Springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade."

We live in a world where we need everything, **NOW**! We often think that more is better than less, faster is better than slower and bigger is better than smaller. Jesus tells us that the Kingdom of God has a small and seemingly insignificant beginning. It grows slowly and perhaps sometimes in ways that we can neither see or appreciate. When a seed is sown we cannot rush its growth. What is required of us is patience and perseverance. The same can be said of God's Kingdom. We do all we can to build up and promote its growth, but God will bring it to fruition and fulfilment.

The image of the Mustard Seed is the perfect analogy for us as we begin the process of right-sizing and reshaping within the Diocese of Buffalo. We begin with small, silent and perhaps seemingly invisible seeds. Even the most spectacular of journeys begins with one step at a time.

We are being called to be faith-filled persons of change. With patience and trust in the workings of the Holy Spirit, we sow seeds of God's Kingdom, always remembering that "Together We Are Stronger." Each small act of kindness, generosity and compassion is a seed of the Kingdom. Every word spoken with love and gentleness is a seed of the Kingdom. How we act and speak has the potential to hurt or encourage others. When we live our daily lives as followers of Jesus we are playing our part in sowing seeds of God's kingdom that will grow in ways that we could never imagine and perhaps never see.

Each of us is called to be people who sow seeds that will grow, flourish and bloom into a stronger, more faith-filled Church. Like the tiny seed that is sown, it will happen in God's time.

Bishop Fisher stated, "The work of the Holy Spirit within our diocese and the support of the Western New York community has been an incredible blessing."

Let us continue to be a blessing as together, in trust, prayer and patience we sow the seeds for a stronger, faith-filled Church.

Dear Parishioners,

Below are the Diocesan recommendations pertaining to our family of parishes. The Buffalo Diocese is Rightsizing and Reshaping of our family of parishes, "WHEAT Scattered and Sown," by reducing our family from five parishes to three parishes.

- 1. Projected number of active priests for this family by 2030 = 3
- 2. Based upon scoring and metrics, it is recommended that the family rightsize and reshape this family evaluating the following recommendations:
 - a. St. Joseph Holland is recommended to merge with Immaculate Conception, East Aurora
 - b. Sell entire campus of St. Joseph, Holland.
 - c. St. George, West Falls is recommended to merge with Immaculate Conception, East Aurora.
 - d. Sell entire campus of St. George, West Falls.
 - e. Annunciation, Elma needs to identify and sell excess properties.
 - f. Post Chapter 11, Annunciation, St. Vincent de Paul, and Immaculate Conception will merge to become one parish with three worship sites.

The clergy and parish leadership will review the recommendations and the determination will be finalized by September 1, 2024.
