### June 23, 2024 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time

## WHEAT SCATTERED AND SOWN EVENTS

Have you ever caught yourself saying "I'm going through a stormy time in my life" or "I wish this dark cloud over my life would go away!" Sometimes we just feel overwhelmed. In today's Gospel the disciples were in a panic because of the violent storm. Perhaps there are times when we too are in panic mode.

What began as a calm "Let us cross over to the other side" boat trip, found Jesus and the disciples in the eye of the storm. You can hear the panic and frustration in their tone, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?"

Each of us, in our own way, have faced and continue to face the storms of life. Physical storms, employment storms, family storms and deeply personal storms that simply overwhelm us. Perhaps we too have found ourselves crying out, "God, do you not care that I am drowning here!" The Gospel today is a challenge. And, it is also hope-filled.

When the disciples wake Jesus, He simply reprimands the wind and the sea, "Quiet! Be Still!" Jesus then turns, looks at the disciples and asks them, "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" When we are going through our own personal struggles and storms in life we often try to go it alone. Or, we may feel that our prayers are not being heard, let alone answered. Our Gospel today is challenging because it asks us to believe and trust that Jesus is with us when we are struggling – when we feel as if we are caught in a storm. The Gospel is hope-filled because sooner or later we find that we need to ask for help. We may just find our calm waters, the answer to our prayers, both from those around us and from God. This is not a sign of weakness; it is in fact a sign of strength.

Today's Gospel challenges us to rely on prayer. It also challenges us to believe that through the pain and storms of life Jesus is with us when we are struggling, afraid and simply overwhelmed. "Do you not yet have faith?"

Are you able to take a step back and in peaceful, faith-filled trust and turn to Jesus and simply ask for help?

Proverbs 3:5-6 - Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths.


