Today's Readings:

Change is difficult. Difficult for us humans. When we try to make a transformation in the way we are, the way we act, or the way we feel, no matter how much we want to, it can be tough to achieve lasting change. We are reminded of this every New Year's. Our power, even over our own selves, has its limits, like it or not. Last week, we heard Jesus tell his disciples, "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me" (Matthew 28:18). Indeed it has, for today we see Jesus transform a loaf of unleavened bread into his body and a cup of wine into his very blood. And not just in the Gospel, for we also witness that power, come among us through the Holy Spirit and expressed by the presider, acting in the person of Christ the high priest, in the Eucharist today. For God, change is not difficult. For God, all transformation is possible. With God, we can be transformed.

Question of the week:

How does the Eucharist transform me? Thinking back to a time when it was not possible for me to receive the Eucharist, for instance during the pandemic, how did its absence affect me?

Be United to Christ and to Others...

This weekend we celebrate the feast of Corpus Christi – The Body and Blood of Jesus. For many of us Mass is a time not only to pray but to be *together* with our parish community. Through our celebration of the Eucharist we are connected to each other and to Jesus in a most sacred and unique way.

The Eucharist is the source and summit of Christian life. What does this mean for us today? It is the source as we draw life and energy from the Body and Blood of Jesus. Celebrating the Eucharist with others helps us to live our daily lives as followers of Jesus. It is the summit to which we are called to return so we can be nurtured and nourished by Jesus.

During the celebration of Mass we hear these words, Lord, let your Spirit come upon these gifts and make them holy. It is not only the bread and wine that is transformed. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, we too are transformed and become the Body of Christ. We are called to be the people of God; witnesses to Christ's presence in the world. Today's feast is not only about receiving the Body of Christ; it is about becoming and being the Body of Christ. The Eucharist is not something that we just receive; as the People of God, we are the Body of Christ.

When Jesus ate his last meal with his disciples He said that whenever we share in this sacred meal we are to do it in memory of Him. Jesus also washed their feet as a sign of service and said that this was the example that they and we are to follow if we want to be His followers. When we care for and serve each other we are also asked to do it in memory of Jesus.

The concluding prayer of the Mass asks us to go now to love and serve the Lord. How do we do this? Quite simply by loving and serving each other as best we can in our daily lives. Because we have shared in the Body and Blood of Christ we are called to love and serve each other as Jesus loves and serves us. We are called care for each other and be communion with those around us, within our families as well as within our community.

Through the Eucharist we are strengthened and encouraged to live our lives as best as we can as followers of Jesus. We show this through how we treat each other. St. Augustine, an early church writer tells us, "Believe what you see, see what you believe and become what you are: the Body of Christ." When we say "Amen", we are saying "Yes! I believe this is the Body and Blood of Christ and that I will be the Body of Christ to others."
