

May 26, 2024 **Most Holy Trinity**

WHEAT SCATTERED AND SOWN EVENTS

The Season of Easter ended last Sunday with the celebration of Pentecost. Today is Trinity Sunday. We are invited to experience God who creates and loves us, Jesus who saves and forgives us, and The Holy Spirit who encourages and strengthens us every day.


The Trinity is rightly called a 'doctrine' of the Church. It is something we are called to accept and believe. We learn about it but in reality we can't really understand it fully. We like to have our questions answered and our problems solved. However, we can't 'solve' the mystery of The Trinity with our logic or a calculator. The Trinity is a matter of prayer and faith; it is a matter of the heart, not the head. The Trinity is a mystery in the sense that it is so endlessly rich and profound that it can never be fully understood. Mystery means that there is always more to learn, more to experience.

The Trinity is not 'out there' somewhere distant and remote or beyond us. It is part of our faith and prayer life, simple as well as profound, When were baptized, it was done with water and holy oil: in the name of The Father, The Son and The Holy Spirit. When we pray we begin and end by making the sign of the cross. When pray or sing The Gloria or the Glory Be, we are calling and praising the powerful Trinity. The Father, Son and Holy Spirit are always with us.

The Trinity is often called the "perfect community of love." God gives us Jesus, who in turn anoints and pours into our lives the Holy Spirit who encourages and strengthens us. Through our faith, prayer and willingness to live as followers of Jesus we are a part of this dynamic, life giving mystery.

Our Gospel today ends with Jesus sending his followers out to proclaim the Kingdom of God. "Go, therefore, make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always until the end of the age."

Jesus sends them out in the name of the Trinity. They are not to rely on their own strength, but on the power of the Holy Trinity. They were not on their own and neither are we today. Each day let us ask the Holy Trinity to guide, lead, strengthen and protect us. Today, make the sign of cross and bless yourself slowly and let the words become a part of you in a personal and intimate way.
